







Logos

- lógos Lo·gos n. (Greek) a word, saying, speech, discourse, thought, proportion, ratio, reckoning, akin to légein to choose, gather, recount, tell over, speak; cf. lection
- Logos word... but also "reason," "purpose," "wisdom"
 - Greek-Cosmic wisdom
 - Hebrew-God's Wisdom
 - Acts 17:18 "...Some also of the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers met him."

Old Testament Understanding

Genesis 1: 1-3

^{1*} IN the beginning God created* the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep; and the Spirit* of God was moving over the face of the waters. ³ And God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light.

Isaiah 55:11

¹¹ ...so shall my word be that goes forth from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and prosper in the thing for which I sent it.

Genesis 1: 1-3



Logos

• John 1:1-5 (RSVCE)

¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God; ³ all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. ⁴ In him was life, and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

- Logos word... again: "reason," "purpose," "wisdom"
- Logos *is* God...
- Logos God from God... the Son of God
- Logos Divine creative power

In principio erat Verbum, et Verbum erat apud Deum, et Deus erat Verbum.

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New Testament

• Hebrews 11:3

3 By faith we understand that the world was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was made out of things which do not appear.


• Hebrews 10: 5-7

5 Consequently, when Christ[b] came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings thou hast not desired, but a body hast thou prepared for me; 6 in burnt offerings and sin offerings thou hast taken no pleasure. 7 Then I said, 'Lo, I have come to do thy will, O God,' as it is written of me in the roll of the book."

Why is it important?

- To know where we came from...
 - ... and who we are trying to get back to
- To know our full identity as children of God



Salvation History Recap



Creation stories

- God creates man and woman in his image
- Created out of love and for love first covenant
- Fell from grace through disobedience ... original sin



- God has a plan to redeem mankind
 - Adam & Eve exiled from Heaven into this world
 - Offspring of the "woman" will crush the devil
 - But, Devil prompts man to sin more and more

God Makes Several Covenants with Mankind



➢ God wipes out all mankind but Noah and his family


- Sin had infused evil throughout the world
- Makes a covenant not to do so ever again



> Mankind forgets God's promises

- Mistrust is a sin that leads to minimizing God
- God scatters the people and confuses their language

God Makes Several Covenants with Mankind




- God calls Abraham out of Ur; makes three promises
 - Promises the land of Canaan to his heirs
 - A great nation will come from his descendents
 - The world will be blessed through his name
- > Abraham begets Isaac, who begets Jacob (Israel)
 - The tribes of Israel are lured into slavery in Egypt
- ➢ God calls Moses to bring Israel out of Egypt
 - Calls 10 plagues onto Egypt culminating with the Passover
 - Makes a covenant with Moses on Mount Sinai
 - Israel doesn't trust God and wanders 40 years in the desert



God Makes Several Covenants with Mankind



- > Tribes of Israel eventually move into Canaan
 - They don't fully comply with God's directives
 - They adopt the culture of pagan tribes and worship idols
- > Israel is led by a series of 12 judges over 200 years
 - They endure several cycles of sin and being conquered
 - They are remorseful and turn back to God to be saved
 - But eventually they forget God and are defeated again
- > The people cry out for a king
 - God concedes and gives them what they ask for
 - Saul is the first king, but is dethroned through sin
 - God chooses David as king and enters a covenant with him



Salvation History Recap

- ➢ Royal Kingdom of Israel divides
 - 10 northern tribes (Israel)
 - 2 southern tribes (Judah)
 - They turn away from God and worship other gods
- Israel falls into servitude again
 - Northern kingdom is defeated and exiled into Assyria
 - Southern kingdom is defeated and exiled into Babylon
- Period of Exile Prophets deliver God's words
 - 10 tribes of Israel lose their identity; never come back
 - 2 tribes of Judah are held together by several prophets
 - Judah is released after 70 years to return to Jerusalem





Salvation History Recap

King Cyrus of Persia releases Israel

- Temple rebuilt by Zerubbabel
- Jerusalem city walls rebuilt by Nehemiah
- Faith in God rebuilt by Ezra







> Judah exists under rule of the great empires

- Held accountable for their sins for 490 years (7x70)
- Persia, Greece and Rome dominate Jewish people
- Maccabean revolt pulls Jewish people together

- Never ending cycle of sin
- Is it here to stay?
- How does Israel atone for sin?



Dealing With Sins

- Sin is bad, but understood as part of the human condition
- Jewish custom was to sacrifice an animal to remove sin (often a lamb)
 - Hands are placed on the guiltless lamb
 - Lamb is slaughtered and blood spread on the altar
 - The body is burned and the smoke carries away the sin
- Animal sacrifice didn't change the heart of the sinner ... it meant nothing

God's Plan Matures


- As the prophets foretold, God sends a savior to redeem man
- Isaiah 53:1-12
 - Foretells of the Messiah's sacrifice to redeem all sin
 - The sacrifice is God himself
- Jeremiah 31: 31-33
 - God will make a new covenant with Israel
 - Read Jeremiah 31: 31-33



How is Jesus the "Word"?


Jesus is the embodiment of...

- Creation...the word spoken by God
 - God calls himself "I Am"... the essence of being
 - Jesus refers to himself as "I Am"
- God's words spoken by the prophets
 - Isaiah 55:11 "So shall my word be that goes...."
- God speaking in person as teacher and healer
 - John 14:23 "Whoever loves me will keep my word...."



Teaching Points of The Catechism

- Jesus is the fullness of revelation
 - The Father's one, perfect, and unsurpassable Word (CCC 65)
- Jesus is the Incarnation of God (CCC 461-464)
 - Jesus is truly God and truly Man; both at the same time
 - Sometimes referred to as the Incarnate Word
- The name Jesus means "God saves" (CCC 430-455)
 - Signifies the very name of God is present in the person of his Son
- Purpose and mystery of Christ's life (CCC 512-570)
 - All that Jesus did and taught is illuminated in the mysteries of the Christmas and Easter seasons



Read CCC 518... a great summary

Seek a Prayerful Understanding

- Our faith has to be more than an academic exercise
 - It needs to be personal for each of us
- We only know ourselves fully through Jesus
 - He wants us to know our Father intimately
 - We won't be ready for Heaven until we know it as home
- Three opportunities for me to know Jesus better
 - John 2: 1-12 The Wedding at Cana
 - 1 John 4: 7-19 God's Love and a Christian Life
 - Ephesians 3:7-21 Commission to Preach God's Plan




The Nature of Jesus

- John 2:5 "Do whatever he tells you."
- Prayerful points for me
 - Mary knows the time is right because she knows the Father
 - She prompts a reluctant Jesus for his first public miracle
 - Jesus is fully human and he was subject to doubt then
 - He acted because he loves, trusts, and honors his mother
 - Mind and heart together are essential to know God's will
 - God guides us through others who know Him



God's Love

- Jewish people continuously fell into the cycle of sin
- They knew His law, but they didn't know Him
 - They lacked faith because they couldn't see Him
 - So, He came to them physically in the person of Jesus
- Jesus became their teacher, reformer, and savior
 - Those who came to know him came to love him
- Those with hardened hearts could not know him
- His primary lesson: God loves them!
 - Love God always, and Love one another as you love yourself
